The Crown Point pilot site was using dollar store aerosol spray to deodorize rooms and bathrooms when needed.

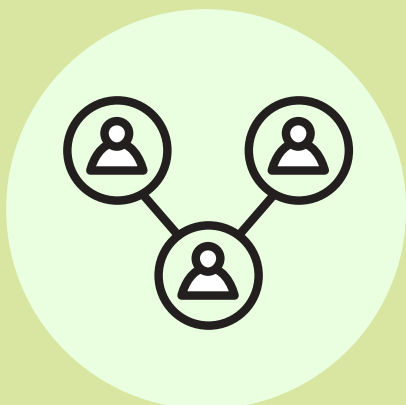
