The Problem

1) We did not recycle our nonconfidential paper effectively.




2) Our paper had NO post-consumer recycled content in it.



- 3) We all use a lot of printing paper with 2019 usage as follows:
- Crown Point pilot site: 90 000 sheets (94 cents per sheet)
 - Dundas pilot site: 120 000 sheets (74 cents per sheet)
 - HFHT Central Office (3 sites) 270 000 sheets

TOTAL: 480 000 sheets of paper used per year





Printing Paper



Paper is made from trees, so these offices are using 32 trees per year* (15 000 sheets per tree). (1)



Paper production also produces harmful chemicals such as dioxins, which are carcinogenic. (2)

Solutions

1) Our goal is always to REDUCE before reusing and recycling. Here are some steps to reduce your office's paper usage:

a) Both pilot sites burn CDs for record requests. You can do the same, or use secure websites or encrypted USBs to transfer information instead!



At Crown Point, these disks reduced our paper use by **40 000 sheets** per year.

 b) We enrolled in e-referrals and are exploring eprescribing through the HFHT's Axe the Fax initiative.

Solution continued:

c) We have paperless records within our EMR.



d) The physicians and other providers now avoid printing forms. We complete them digitally, add electronic signatures, upload them to the EMR then either print or fax them. We use free Adobe Acrobat Reader or Notability at each workstation.



e) We try not to pre-print items in case they need to be updated or edited. If we do print, our standard printer setting is double-sided.



f) We make use of email and voicemail communication instead of letter.




g) Most meeting agendas are emailed instead of printing.



h) Printers and copiers are maintained, as paper jams and low quality printing result in a great amount of waste.

Solution continued:

2) It is also crucial to REUSE.

We sourced 100% Post-Consumer waste paper!

Brand: Rolland

Cheapest Source: Costco - \$17.39 for 1500 sheets



We tried it out and it works in all of our printers!

3) We should also RECYCLE

Both pilot sites confirmed that their shredded confidential paper is recycled.

Benefits:



Social

This can be an opportunity for us to use new technology, which is especially helpful during this time of remote work.

Economic

By burning records onto CDs, Crown Point saves \$376 per year.

The 100% recycled paper is more expensive (\$700 more per year for Crown Point). However our reduced usage will greatly offset this expense.





